Based on 216 responses (22% of all staff)

More than **65%**

of staff feel they have enough information about All Together Better and the vanguard to understand where they fit in the new model of care

87%

of staff agree or strongly agree that they understand why we are all working together as All Together Better

There is still work to be done in making sure everyone understands the benefits of the new care model to improving the health and well-being of patients/ service users and their carers

Most people would recommend All Together Better to family or someone they know could benefit from it

The majority of people



agreed that there was a trust and openness across all the team members

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The majority of people think that All Together Better is just about saving money – not the reality

Overall, more than 70% of people feel proud to be part of All Together Better



Optimistically, the majority of people did agree that they had seen a positive change in how they provide care and support

Almost 80%

Believe they have seen a positive change in the way they work collaboratively with other colleagues

The vast majority of people agreed they understood their role in joined-up teams



69% of people understand the skills and abilities of their colleagues and the majority feel part of All Together Better

There were mixed views on whether All Together Better is making a difference to service users and their carers. And while most think the level of service is better, many are still unconvinced

Out of a total of 189 people, 100 would prefer to find out general information about All Together Better through team meetings/ briefs.. 74 people prefer the ATB bulletin, closely followed by direct mail at 34.9%
